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

In the very middle of the Danish springtime we have the pleasure of heartily welcoming our English visitors - the girls from the Basingstoke High School, London, and their headmistress. We really do hope that our guests will spend a couple of interesting, entertaining and instructive days.

Some cool facts about "Metropolitanskolen".

Etablished about the year of 1250 as a school belonging to the cathedral "Our Lady".

During the 700 years of its existence it has been moved about in the capital of Denmark, Copenhagen, and today the building, which you are visiting now, gives shelter to nearly 450 pupils, of whom about only 50 girls -- .

One headmaster and a staff of 25 masters are trying to teach us the most common subjects, including foreign languages like English (we really do hope that we have been taught good English) German, French, Latin and Greek.

The system of the Danish School is in short: Every little girl and each little' boy are starting their academical career when 7 years of age. For five years they attend the so-called "Under skole". Having finished these five grades, those of the pupils, who are clever enough, will move into the "Mellemskole" a four years' instructive school, preparing the pupils for the higher school "Gymnasiet", which consists of three forms and which ends up in the "Studentereksamen" - corresp. to matriculation examination - after which the students move into the universities.

Although the Danish weather is just as surprising as we love it to be, we hope that it will present you with days of sunshine during your visit to Denmark.

And, too, we heartily wish that you will get the impression that Denmark is more than Hans Christian Andersen and the little mermaid.

The reconstruction of the state of the Danish school

During the days of this week very important debates are held about an alteration of the state of the Danish school, was established in the year 1903. The participants are the Danish minister for education and a representation of the teaching profession of Denmark.

The existing state is formed in this way:

- 1) a preparatory school of five years
- 2) a/ an examination school of four years b/ non-examination school of three four years -:- the school is left.
- 3) I/a gymnasium consisting of 3 lines classical line, mathematical-, languages line - of three years -:- the school is left.

II/ a "modern school" of one year: - the school is left.

According to the law children are only due to attend school for 7 years, that is to say from their seventh to their forteenth year. Consequently many pupils take the apportunity of leaving the school at the end of the mentioned 14' year.

Our statistic shows that 30 % af the pupils af that part of the school, which gives a grade after examination, are leaving A welcome in school English.

the school having attended it for 2 years, while, in that part of the school, which offers no admittance of a grade, 60 % of the pupils take leave of schooldays after 2 years acquaintance of sweat, blood fears cavsed by their struggling with school subjects.

a modern school

of two years.
